
The Art & Design Curriculum

INTENT

The Art & Design Department is dedicated to nurturing critical thinking and visual literacy through an engaging and supportive environment. Our curriculum is designed to foster independence through differentiated and self-directed work. We wish to develop a lifelong aptitude and desire to learn, explore, create and invent. We encourage students to experiment, persevere and arrive at their own unique solution while promoting the importance of knowledge, skill building, discovery, and innovation. Engaging students through 'real-life' experiences and hands-on practical learning are part of our core ethos. Incorporating historical references and contemporary artists, designers and makers into the curriculum exposes students to global awareness and viewpoints other than their own.

IMPLEMENTATION

Through mastery we have designed an inclusive programme of delivery and suitable options at Key Stage 3, 4 and 5 that covers the breadth of students' interest and adapts to the changing needs of the students. All subjects are accessible at Key Stage 4 regardless of previous standard and guidance will be offered from members of staff regarding the suitability of the course. The Art & Design Department will promote group work, individual work, a team building experience and importantly adaptability to others peoples' needs – factors that may not always be met in other disciplines. The Art & Design Curriculum, which is also delivered as specialisms in Photography, Textiles and Graphic Design is designed to find each students individual strengths. The mastery pedagogy works on the principle that all learners, with time & effort, will meet expectations and we have carefully constructed a curriculum that allows the time and steady progression for Mastery and builds knowledge that is portable to GCSE.



We will ensure that Art & Design are encouraged and celebrated in the school and it is our aim to find a Creative subject for every student. It is vital for every individual student who wishes to develop their creative abilities through curricular or extra-curricular development and have the opportunity to do so. Working in a collaborative peer-learning environment, students develop creative problem-solving skills, self-expression, and visual literacy. Students at Brixham College enjoy Creative subjects and this results in well-motivated, successful learners who achieve their goals and ambitions.

CASE STUDIES

Meet: Monty Burston
